Mission statement

The mission of the Small Carnivore Specialist Group (SCSG) is to build capacity among small carnivore researchers and conservationists, generate information on species status, provide venues to generate and publish new knowledge, and to maintain the most up-to-date status assessments for the group's species.

Projected impact 2021–2025

Projected impacts for the 2021–2025 period are: better public awareness on the priority small carnivores for conservation; better awareness on the links between carnivore trade/use and zoonotic disease; and updated Red List assessments for the group's 170+ species with a particular focus on small carnivore species distributed in North, Central and South America and Madagascar. T-004 Develop a working group to coordinate the conservation of Malagasy carnivores between the group's members, EAZA and local NGOs in range countries.

T-007 Develop a multi-language species record database for mainland Southeast Asia (Thailand, Viet Nam, Cambodia, Lao PDR, and Myanmar).

T-009 Increase membership from priority countries or regions: Madagascar, Southeast Asia, West Africa, Central Africa.

T-001 Establish a new website for the Small Carnivore Specialist Group to highlight the group's conservation priorities and the work of its membership.

Number of publications produced in internal journals of SSC groups: 1

Result description: A 2021 issue of the group's peer-reviewed journal, *Small Carnivore Conservation*, was produced. The journal is now being revised and will migrate to the Open Journal Systems (OJS) system. The revamped journal will be completed by mid-2022.


