

## International UNESCO Centre for the Mediterranean Biosphere Reserves

Category 2 Centres (C2C) are centres and institutes that function under the auspices of UNESCO in a specific way under the UN model: they are created and financed by member states, and their main aim is to contribute to achieving UNESCO's strategic programme objectives and enhancing the impact and visibility of UNESCO's action.

<u>The International UNESCO Centre for the Mediterranean Biosphere Reserves (CRBMed)</u> is based on an agreement between the National Parks Autonomous Agency (OAPN) of the Spanish Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Environment and the Abertis Foundation committed to engage in support of UNESCO's strategic programme objectives.

As a unique Category 2 Centre created by a public-private agreement, CRBMed renders technical assistance in areas of UNESCO's competence through capacity-building and training, research, networking, knowledge-sharing and exchange of information in relation to Mediterranean Biosphere Reserves. In addition, it carries out actions in support of the World Network of Biosphere Reserves, the Spanish Network, and also regional and subject area networks of the MAB Programme in which Spain participates.

The challenges that have been assumed by CRBMed are described in the following strategic guidelines:

- Strengthening relations between Mediterranean Biosphere Reserves and establishing strong links, networks and cooperation between BR from both coastlines of the Mediterranean, thus promoting joint research about the main socio-environmental issues in the region.
- **Communication, training and environmental education**: to support and to contribute in the organization of communication, dissemination, environmental education and training programs.
- **Documentation Centre**: to create a space for the compilation, query, attention and information exchange in relation with the Biosphere Reserves Network.
- Strengthening links between academy, society and companies: to promote projects related to key issues in the Mediterranean area, especially those concerning global change, bioeconomy, water management, biodiversity and sustainable tourism.
