

THE FOOTPRINT OF MEXICO, CENTRAL AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN ONE NATURE, ONE FUTURE. With less than 2% of the planet, Mexico, Central America and the Caribbean is one of the most megadiverse regions in the world harbouring seven to ten percent of known species. Its natural and cultural capital is exceptional, with a diversity of communities, ethnic groups and indigenous peoples who have inhabited the area for thousands of years, protecting and living in harmony with natural resources.

It contains the second most important barrier reef in the world, 8% of the earth's remaining mangroves and one of the five flagship forests of the region shared by Belize, Guatemala and Mexico: the Selva Maya. The Caribbean islands form one of the major centres of endemic biodiversity in the world due to the region's geography and climate.

Paradoxically, the region runs an ecological deficit due to urbanisation, inappropriate land use and energy matrices that rely on fossil fuels. Despite a considerable decline in poverty and inequality during the last 20 years, the Covid-19 pandemic is expected to cause a rapid upsurge of social and economic problems. Based on the achievements obtained in the implementation of the IUCN Programme 2017-2020, IUCN ORMACC will continue innovating the new IUCN Programme 2021-2024 and its Nature 2030 agenda, in response to the needs and demands of the countries:

- scaling up initiatives with investments to generate greater impacts;
- strengthening regional actions and facilitating the countries' global positioning;
- adapting and applying standards and tools for valuing the services that ecosystems provide at landscape level for decision making; and
- expanding its actions in coastal zones and areas highly vulnerable to climate change and poverty.

INNOVATIONS IN RESPONSE TO THE CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES OF MEXICO, CENTRAL AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN

The actions prioritised by IUCN ORMACC in the Regional Action Plan were strategic for a successful implementation of the IUCN Programme 2017-2020 and its contribution to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). These innovations helped address the challenges and capitalise on the region's opportunities.

During this period, intersectoral collaboration was increased with institutions such as agriculture, fishing and tourism ministries; water-governing institutions; farming and ranching associations; municipalities; academia and the private sector to promote comprehensive approaches in conserving nature compatible with production actions.

The region's international positioning was strengthened by increasing the visibility of its interventions and results in the frame of global initiatives and commitments, such as the **Bonn Challenge**, **International Marine Protected Areas Congress**, **III Latin American and Caribbean Congress of Protected Areas (III CAPLAC)**, **Sub-regional meeting on the Action Plan for World Heritage (UNESCO), World Water Forum, COP14 of the Convention on Biological Diversity, Pre-COP25**, and others.



Guidelines on species management and closed seasons, based on commercial fishing pressure, were established by consensual agreement in over 100,000 ha of Guatemala Caribbean marine areas.

The first Latin America Regional Expert Assessment Group for the Green List (EAGL) was created, thanks to the harmonisation of Selva Maya protected areas management effectiveness.

The Caribbean Protected Areas Gateway is used for decisions about management of the 269 marine and 519 terrestrial protected areas.

In the frame of the Biodiversity and Protected Areas Management (BIOPAMA) Programme, 1.5 million euros were allocated to national organisations in **15 Caribbean countries**, including IUCN Members in Haiti, Belize and the Dominican Republic, to improve management effectiveness and governance of protected areas.

In zones inhabited or used by indigenous peoples, particularly in **Honduras, Guatemala and Nicaragua** as well as national and shared basins of Meso America, agreements and bio-protocols were achieved under the rights-based and gender equality approach to regulate natural resource management.



In support for the implementation of **business models** based on good governance, financing schemes were promoted in vulnerable communities for their productive diversification and stability. The State of Oaxaca has an investment prospectus portfolio to mobilise public and private resources.

Based on technical, financial and social criteria and to support **productive landscape restoration**, seven countries in the region have forest landscape restoration strategies at national and subnational level and have committed to restoring 8.4 million ha by 2030. The processes implemented have enabled decision-makers at different levels to negotiate financing with science-based information.

In **Honduras** and in six shared basins of **Mexico** and **Central America**: more than 30,000 families adopted nature-based solutions for climate change adaptation and disaster risk reduction.

Coastal-marine zone management was reinforced integrating attention to coastal populations and ecosystems, particularly in the **Caribbean and Northern Triangle of Central America**, contributing to SDG 14. These actions laid the foundation for generating information, supporting policies, regulations and activities that support national and regional priorities in blue economy.



Tools for valuing ecosystem services at the level of landscapes and **urban and periurban** basins were adapted and validated in **Guatemala** and **Costa Rica**. This was a recognition of Central America's mounting urbanisation and urgent need to address challenges concerning water security and disaster impacts. Governance practices, structures and dynamics were defined, along with public-private partnerships for investment that supports decision making. The World Conservation Congress will be a great opportunity for IUCN ORMACC, its Members, partners and allies to share the advances, challenges and especially proposals, to reinforce and adjust, together, the path toward nature-based recovery, the commitments to climate change and the post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework.
