Policy Issues and Options

* How for the topic of the policy brief relates to national priorities?

- *Generally agreed that it covers the topics of national importance.
- *Information on Pakistan situation is rather scanty and can be elaborated.

* Are the key issues identified in the Policy Briefs relevant to the topic and the priority nature?

- *Generally policy issues covers the topic.
- *Drainage water and wastewater which is being discharged into river bodies should also be mentioned as a major issue.
- *Problems of eastern rivers should also be mentioned.

* Whether the options listed in the policy briefings are of practical nature and viable?

- * Dialogue should be initiated after complete home work based on scientific data analysis to support our arguments.
- *No need for another organization as mentioned in 4.2 as it will complete the issues.
- *For changing mindset of the people, people to people contact, exchange visits of scientists and civil society persons should be encouraged.
- *An independent commission may be established-consisting of experts of both sides for informal discussions.
- * Mass awareness campaign can be launched jointly.
- *Hydro-power projects monitoring should be given priority. CBMs are needed for trust development especially on data sharing.

* Any other issues related to Brief?

- *Issues of minimum flows in eastern rivers for domestic purposes should be discussed especially in low flow times.
- *Comprehensive basin study should be initiated to understand current groundwater situation, water table declines and quality degradation.
- *Brief should discuss how a trustable data set can be established which is acceptable to both countries—a third party monitoring could be an option.
- *Issues pertaining to eastern rivers should also be highlighted as they are equally important.

* How to improve Policy Brief?

- *Its size may be further reduced for easy ready.
- *Brief is heavily based on the information and data collected by Indian scientists. It is suggested that references of work done in Pakistan should also be included.
- *Success stories from the world should be made part of the brief as examples.
- *Overall impact of Indian actions on Pakistan should be supported by concrete data and arguments.
- *References should be added for further reading on the issues mentioned in the brief.

* What IUCN can do more?

- *IUCN should take lead in internationalizing these issues.
- *Joint think tank should be established—IUCN can facilitate with possible funding from Dutch or other donors.
- *These forums should be made sustainable.
- *IUCN can also facilitate dialogue within Pakistan on these issues to develop consensus.
