Professor Denise E. Antolini serves as the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs at the William S. Richardson School of Law, University of Hawai'i at Mānoa (2011-present). Her research interests include marine law and policy, environmental review, species protection, fresh and marine water protection, cultural rights, community based management, natural resources enforcement, and environmental courts and tribunals.
