He previously served as a member of Conservation International's Indigenous Advisory Group (IAG) and as the East Africa Regional Representative for the Indigenous Peoples of Africa Coordinating Committee (IPACC), where he spearheaded Indigenous Peoples engagement in REDD+ in Africa. I have also served in the UNREDD policy board, REDD+ Social and Environmental Standards Committee and spearheaded multi-stakeholder consultations in the preparation of REDD+ readiness packages for Kenya and Uganda serving a Consultant for the Forest Carbon Partnership Facility (FCPF). communities in Kenya and East Africa generally on diverse issues that relate to their rights. He has a Doctorate degree in Law from the University of Arizona, USA and his thesis focused on indigenous Peoples rights in the context of carbon credit schemes in Kenya.

He is law lecturer, Egerton University in Kenya and Kenya Advocacy Officer, Minority Rights Group International. Former, member and chairperson, United Nations Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues.
