### GLOBAL

---

- Version 1.1 of the User Manual has been approved by the Management Committee on 06 April. The final version of the User Manual will be available online soon, following integration of their feedback.
- New Visual Identity Guidelines for the use of the IUCN Green List logo have been finalized and are available at [https://www.iucn.org/sites/dev/files/iucn\\_gl\\_guidelines\\_final.pdf](https://www.iucn.org/sites/dev/files/iucn_gl_guidelines_final.pdf)
- The Operations Team had a virtual meeting on 15 March where key topics included screening conditions for new jurisdictions joining the Green List programme, additional details on the re-listing procedure, and green list programme engagement at CBD COP 14 in November in Egypt. Sites can contact their regional/country focal points for any queries.

### REGIONAL

---

- **Maghreb:** A Regional Expert Assessment group for the Green List (EAGL) is forming in this North African region, starting with Algeria, Morocco and Tunisia, coordinated by IUCN's [Centre for Mediterranean Cooperation](#). The Call for Expressions of Interest to apply to become EAGL members closed in mid-April with lots of interest from each country. EAGL formation and training will take place in May and June.
- **Middle East:** A Regional EAGL is forming in this region, based on interest expressed initially by several countries and states including Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Palestine, Saudi Arabia and United Arab Emirates, coordinated by IUCN's [Regional Office for West Asia](#). The EAGL Call closed in March and formation and training is expected in May and June.
- **Vietnam:** EAGL training took place in April. Adapted indicators and their public consultation are expected in May and June.
- **European Union:** Work advanced on draft adapted indicators for the 'Green List for N2K' project, with a workshop conducted in Malaga, Spain in March. The project is now inviting interested stakeholders to participate in a public consultation to collect feedback on the IUCN Green List Adapted Indicators for Natura 2000 sites. The deadline is 7 May 2018 – more information available [here](#).
- **Caribbean:** The IUCN Green List programme was introduced to the Caribbean region at the regional inception meeting of the Biodiversity and Protected Areas Management (BIOPAMA) Programme in Kingston, Jamaica. Some Caribbean states are expected to join the Green List programme in 2018.
- **Africa:** Kenya's EAGL has updated its indicators for Version 1.1 of the Green List standard; Nigeria's National Park Service has officially committed 3 National Parks to the Green List programme; and, introductions to the Green List programme were given based on expression of interest by appropriate governmental and non-governmental institutions in Madagascar and Seychelles - commitments from these 2 countries are expected later this year.
